CRTA: METHODOLOGY

Target population | Adult citizens of the Republic of Serbia

Sample size | 1065 respondents

Data collection method | Computer-assisted telephone interviewing (CATI)

Type of sample Random sample - RDD (Random digit dialing), Representative for the Republic of Serbia

Poststratification | By region, type of settlement, sex, age and education

Questionnaire length | 15 minutes

Response rate 18% (interviewed/successfully contacted)

Margin of error 3.1%

Data collection period | February 8 - 13, 2025.

CRTA conducted public opinion research using its own resources and for its own needs

The continuation of the protests inspires hope and optimism among the citizens who support them


What would you say, which of the following feelings has been the most common for you lately, was it...

Citizens who support the protests are changing the perception of the direction in which the country is moving


In your opinion, is Serbia moving in the right or wrong direction?



Support for the protests is growing, but citizens' attitudes are also becoming more polarized


To what extent do you support the protests?





For the last two months, the biggest increase in support for the protests was recorded among those who support the parties in power


To what extent do you support the protests?





A third of citizens claim to have participated in protests at least once in the last three months


In the last three months, have you, at least once, participated in protests that are organized throughout Serbia?





Almost 60% of citizens trusts the students, while the President of the Republic, Aleksandar Vučić, is trusted by a third of citizens


What would you say, who do you trust more...





About 60% of citizens believe that Aleksandar Vučić is not competent in the matter of student demands


In your opinion, is Aleksandar Vučić competent to fulfill the demands of students?






Most of the student demands have extremely high support, which presents the potential for further support for the protests

I will now read a few items to you. Please tell me whether you support them or not.






Demographic profile of citizens regarding support for requests for document publication






Support for the request to publish documentation in relation to political and media preferences






The majority of citizens do not believe in manipulations regarding protests. They think that the protests are the result of state corruption and point out that the demands have not been met

People have different views regarding the tragedy in Novi Sad and the student protests that followed. To what extent do you agree with the following statements?




Perceptions about the fulfillment of student demands - demographic profile






Perceptions about the fulfillment of student demands in relation to political and media preferences
