Data collection period	September 13 - 27, 2025.



Over half of Serbian citizens believe the country is moving in the wrong direction, while a third say that Serbia is moving in the right direction


In your opinion, is Serbia moving in the right or wrong direction?





After a short-lived surge of optimism among those supporting the students and the protests at the beginning of the year, the current sentiment is similar to that following the canopy collapse in December 2024


In your opinion, is Serbia moving in the right or wrong direction?





A third of citizens who believe the country is moving in the right direction are mostly older and less educated individuals, as well as those who follow pro-government media and vote for ruling parties


In your opinion, is Serbia moving in the right or wrong direction?

Which of the following feelings has been the most common for you lately, was it...






As with views on the direction of the country, the current situation is very similar to that at the beginning of the protests in December of last year. Optimism is not the prevailing sentiment

What would you say are the biggest problems Serbia faces at the moment?




Top ten problems are shown


What would you say are the biggest problems Serbia faces at the moment?

What would you say are the biggest problems Serbia faces at the moment?





PROTESTS AND BLOCADES



Almost six out of ten Serbian citizens support the protests. Polarization among citizens is evident - the share of citizens with moderate views on the protests is decreasing


Protests are being held across Serbia following the collapse of the canopy at the railway station in Novi Sad, which killed 16 people. Do you support these protests?





Support for the protests has remained stable from the beginning until today


Protests are being held across Serbia following the collapse of the canopy at the railway station in Novi Sad, which resulted in the deaths of 16 people. Do you support these protests?


Nearly 40% of citizens say they trust the students, while a quarter trust Aleksandar Vučić


Who do you trust more...





Above-average, trust in Vučić comes only from older and less educated citizens, as well as from those who follow pro-government media and vote for ruling party







Nearly half of Serbian citizens rate Aleksandar Vučić's performance as President negatively


How would you rate Aleksandar Vučić's performance as President so far?

Which of the following two statements better reflects your opinion?


- It doesn't matter to me who takes power, as long as Vučić is gone

Vučić is seen as a guarantor of peace and stability primarily by older and less educated citizens, as well as by those who follow pro-government media and vote for ruling parties


Which of the following two statements better reflects your opinion?





Nearly two-thirds of Serbian citizens currently see calling elections as a way out of the crisis


In your opinion, should snap parliamentary elections be called within the next 6 months in order to resolve the current crisis the country is facing?





Nearly every third voter of the ruling parties believes that elections should be called


In your opinion, should snap parliamentary elections be called within the next 6 months in order to resolve the current crisis the country is facing?
